I recently returned from a cruise trip to Hawaii. I noted on the daily activity sheet the cruise line was providing for a "Solo" meeting place each afternoon at 5:30 in the ships wine bar. The first day my cabin mate and I went down with high expectations of meeting some other single people and making some new friends. To my dismay, we saw no one! As we were leaving there was one gentleman sitting to the side in a gently lit area and he asked if we would like to join him. He was very nice, he was recently widowed and from Australia. I had the pleasure of visiting with him again a few nights later at the Luau, he said that there had only been a couple of other ladies come to the Solo hour one other night.

The HASSDA staff has been told many times that single people do not get to dance when they go to the annual Festival by themselves. Last year we started something new with the Solo Meet and Greet, with the Pink, Blue and Purple ribbons to make it easier for "singles" to identify someone that they could "ask to dance"! We also chipped in \$500.00 for a Solo Meet & Greet at the National Convention in Des Moines along with SSDUSA and the National committee matched our combined amount to provide a meeting place and a snack buffet. All we asked was that each person register ahead of time and pay \$5.00. We had a nice turn out but I cannot believe how many people said they didn't know about it or they would have gone!!! Information about the National Meet and Greet was in 2, if not 3 of the HASSDA Newsletters prior to the National Convention. Are we reading our newsletter or like one friend of mine, sloughing it off as "just another newsletter"?

In spite of the turn out, we still got comments about no one asking "me" to dance or I could not find any singles in the dance halls. This is where my first comment comes in. **You can lead a "Solo/Single" to a meet & greet, but you cannot force them to play**. I noted at the restaurant that several people came in with people they already knew and sat with those same people and when I approached some of them, introduced myself and asked if they were enjoying themselves, they basically gave me the brush-off! People, you need to do your part for this to work, just as you do your part in a square (your partner cannot do it alone), if you are sitting out, SMILE, look like you are having a good time. No one wants to dance with a sourpuss! If you are shy as I once was, swallow, take a deep breath, put one foot in front of the other and advance to someone with an Ask Me To Dance ribbon or a Pink (only dances girl part), a Blue ribbon (only dance the boy part) or a Purple ribbon (can dance either boy or girl). Some may even be wearing a "Plus" tag on their ribbon to indicate they can dance plus as well as mainstream! Believe me, after the first time you ask, it gets easier. Yes, there will be times a person will decline but do not take offence. They may need to rest a tip, go to the bathroom, get a drink, or any Number of other things. Just thank them, move on and ask someone else. You cannot really enjoy a Convention unless you cut lose and "meet and greet" other dancers!!

Oh yes, I got permission from Maye to "bump" her out of first position in this newsletter! This was not written to offend anyone but hopefully to <u>Jolt</u> us all into being proactive at our Festival and, for that matter, at all dances.

them to dance! REMEMBER that we will give a FREE registration to next year's HASSDA Festival to the dancer that dances with the MOST DIFFERENT Partners each night of the Festival. So look for the signs and if you don't have a partner, or if you see someone looking for a partner, ask them to dance. Couples will still be wearing the red (Partnered) ribbon so you will know who is available to dance and what position/level they dance.

Don't forget we will be having Mixers for the first hour in the Smoothie Hall each night to help you get acquainted. The goal is to have fun! We have lined up a great list of callers in Jeff Holley, Noah Siegmann, Scott Bennett and Sonya Savell-Jones. They will keep your toes tapping and your face smiling!
