### Etiquette on the Dance Floor

A few problems and questions have arisen having to do with what proper dance etiquette is and what isn't. Now, I'll admit I'm not the Emily Post of square dancing, so I decided to ask some other dancers and a few callers to see what they thought about it.

One issue, which was discussed at the HASSDA General Meeting in July, was that of entering a square without a partner and then signaling that a partner is needed. This is not the same situation as one person entering a square first but with a partner already lined up to join it. Some solo dancers have been taught that this is inconsiderate, and some were taught that it's okay to do. The problem is that it holds up the dance, waiting for a partner who may or may not show up, when a "ready-to-go" couple could have that spot and get the tip going without delay. Most callers I spoke with find this very irritating since it interrupts the flow of the dance. If it occurs continuously throughout the dance, so much time is wasted that fewer tips can be called.

The consensus from the HASSDA group was that solos need to have partners established ahead of time for the next tip. Therefore, it's helpful to have an area for solos to congregate if they are looking for partners at any dance event, be it the home club or a festival/convention. At either event it can be difficult to find other single dancers in time, when the room is crowded, or you are visiting a club and aren't familiar with who the solo dancers are. There shouldn't be any stigma about this, it's just simply common-sense logistics.

And speaking of the term "solo dancer", it has nothing to do with marital status, dating, cohabitating, etc. It simply means a male or female dancer who doesn't have a dance partner for the next tip or for the current dance or for any dance event. It does not mean a solo dancer is necessarily trying to find someone to date or marry or lure away from a spouse. Some solos are married to non-dancers; and are NOT looking for romance.

Another issue that arose in a square that I was in at the HASSDA Festival, was "square jumping". This is when one dancer or couple leaves the square to "bump" someone out of a different square, who then go and bump other dancers and so on. This is a form of "mixer" that some dancers love to do because it can be very fun. However, it can create a few unintended problems. By leaving a square without arranging in advance for another person/couple to step right in to take your place, you have caused the square to abruptly break down for lack of a fourth couple. In the square I was in, no other couple ever came to fill in; we had to wait for the second half of the tip and hope a new couple would join us. It's not fair to assume that the rest of the square can continue with a "ghost" couple, which is very difficult for most dancers, and it was not the expectation of the remaining couples when they began the tip.

Perhaps square jumping should only occur (1) during special mixer tips, or (2) when the whole square knows in advance and can decide if they want to participate and the "jumping" or trading occurs between adjacent squares. Also, respect the callers by at least letting them know to expect it so they are not distracted and embarrassed on stage.

And one more thing to consider:

A caller's wife told me, "My husband has spent years and much time and effort honing his calling skills

to make a dance entertaining for everyone. It's a bit hurtful to think that dancers aren't having enough fun, if they feel they have to create their own."

So, this should open discussion about these etiquette issues; tell us what you think! You can email me or call and leave your suggestions to be compiled and discussed at HASSDA board meetings and/or the general meeting next summer in Manhattan.

#### TION: SOLO DANCER LOOKING FOR A PARTNER.

How do you go about getting a partner at a dance? Here are some tips for dancing a lot more tips:

- 1. Get there early. Many dancers plan their whole night of tips at the beginning.
- Don't be afraid to ask. You never know until you ask.
- 3. Display your SOLO and levels of dance proudly! Badges, ribbons, and the like that tell everyone you need a partner and what levels and positions you can dance.
- 4. Be a good dancer and a good listener. You're more likely to be asked again if you prove yourself on the dance floor. The best way to be a top-notch dancer is to dance as often as you can.
- 5. Don't be shy: just be friendly and introduce yourself
- 6. Remember to have a partner before you get on the dance floor don't take a spot that a ready couple could have filled. Take this time to ask someone for the next tip!
