She looked forward to "sister night" with Janelle, phone calls from Scott, postcards from Alicia, and visits with everyone she knew! With Allen & Marcia being lifelong square dancers and Allen a caller, Karen attended countless square dances with them in the state of Kansas and beyond. Karen always took special joy in using her winnings to bring a bucket of ice cream to the refreshment table at subsequent dances.
